Melbourne Radio and Records Conference 16-17 February 1993

he Radio and Records Conference is held annually in conjunction with the Melbourne Music Festival. The Festival and the Conference are organised by the Victorian Rock Foundation, a non-profit organisation funded by the Victorian Government. Its aim is to assist the development of the Victorian contemporary music industry.

The Conference consisted of a series of panels covering topics such as artist management, piracy and touring but some also addressed broadcasting issues.

Specifically, the first panel of the Con-

ference, entitled 'Who's In Charge?', concerned itself exclusively with the new broadcasting legislation and with the ABA. The ABA was represented on this panel by Ed Jonker, Senior Project Officer, who discussed the legislation in terms of the key issues of service diversity (through the class licence regime) and self regulation (through Codes of Practice).

The Conference attracted about 80 people, including representatives from record companies and other music industry bodies, commercial and community radio stations and from the press.
