

New radio licence for Ceduna

SYDNEY: The ABA has released its licence area plan for community and open narrowcasting radio in the Ceduna region of South Australia.

One channel has been made available for a community radio service for Ceduna. A channel has also been made available for an open narrowcasting radio service at Ceduna/Smoky Bay.

'The decision to make a channel available for a community radio service follows interest expressed by community aspirants. The licence for a community radio service will be allocated via a merit-based selection process which has been developed by the ABA,' said Mr Peter Webb, ABA Chairman.

The decision to make a channel available for an open narrowcasting service follows interest in providing a tourist information service for the Ceduna region. The ABA is currently developing a system for issuing open narrowcasting licences and expects the licence for this service to be issued via an auction later this year.

Details of the community and narrowcasting radio licence area plan for Ceduna will be available for viewing at the Ceduna public library, or can be obtained from the ABA by calling freecall 1800 810 241.
