# Work plan for the allocation of community broadcasting licences 

The ABA has so far made 41 new community broadcasting licences available as a result of its planning process.
The ABA published a proposed work plan for the allocation of new community broadcasting licences in the November edition of $A B A$ Update. The ABA also called for comment on the development of a policy on the order and timing of licence allocations, and proposed that the criteria to be considered in deciding where and when to call for applications should include:

- the principles embodied in the ABA planning priorities established in 1993;
- whether an area already has a community radio service;
- the existing radio services available in the area; and
- whether known aspirant broadcasting groups are well placed to pursue licence allocation at that time (for
example, whether applicants have the necessary establishment funds and are likely to be in a position to commence a new service within a year).
The ABA received comment from the Community Broadcasting Association of Australia; the National Indigenous Broadcasting Association of Australia; the National Ethnic and Multicultural Broadcasters' Council; the Public Sector Management Office of the Western Australian Ministry of the Premier and Cabinet, 6 SON Christian Broadcasters and Radio for the Print Handicapped.
As comments supported the criteria the ABA proposed, the ABA has decided to start the allocation of a further five licences: two in Mt Isa (Qld), one in Kangaroo Island (SA) and one each on York and Meekatharra (WA) (see Table 1 below). The order and timing of allocation for licences shown in Table 2 is yet to be determined. Having consid-
ered the criteria set out above, along with the preparedness of known aspirant groups, the ABA is not satisfied at this time that commencement of allocation exercises in these areas would be productive.
The $A B A$ intends to maintain an open and flexible approach to its licence allocation work plan to maximise the likelihood of successful allocation exercises and thus allow as many new services to go to air as quickly as possible. The ABA welcomes comment on the order and timing of the allocation of available licences as the work plan at any time, as it is under continual review.
The ABA will settle the work plan for publication at least on a quarterly basis in the first week of February, May, August and November. Comments received before those dates will be able to $D$ be considered in that quarter.
