Sydney 2000 Forum

'Young People and the Media Tomorrow', convened by the International Forum of Researchers

The Sydney 2000 Forum is the second major meeting of the International Forum of Researchers. With a theme of 'Young people and the media tomorrow', it will provide participants from all corners of the world with the opportunity to present research.

The forum encourages dialogue and interaction between the research community, regulators, producers and educators, and there will be opportunity for discussions on research methodology and the use of technology in studies. The focus is not only on television, but on all areas of the media: print, radio and the Internet.

The forum will be held in Sydney from 27 November to 1 December 2000, and it will be hosted by the Australian National Commission for UNESCO, with support from the ABA.

Draft code of practice for the Internet

The Internet Industry Association of Australia (IIA) released its fifth draft 'For Adoption' version of the Internet Industry Code of Practice on 30 August 1999.

The draft code's approach to content regulation can be reduced to four words '... industry facilitated user empowerment', said Mr Peter Coroneos, IIA's Executive Director.

IIA's draft code requires Internet service providers (ISPs) to provide Internet users with information and links to filtering software and other access control methods. It also provides best practice benchmarks in a range of areas, including user privacy, e-commerce transactions, spamming (unsolicited emails), copyright, and fair dealing practices.

The Broadcasating Services Act requires that codes of practice be developed by industry, in consultation with the community. The ABA registers codes if certain legislative requirements are met.

IIA expects to register the code before the end of the year. The draft code is available for on the IIA's web site at <www.iia.net.au>.
