Gosforrd commercial radio licence allocation suspended

The ABA has susppended the allocation of a new commercial raradio broadcasting licence in Gosford, New Souuth Wales. The ABA called for applications for thhe licence in October 2000.

An application hhas been filed in the Federal Court to review thhe ABA's decision to make a new commercial raradio licence available in the Gosford area. Untitil further order, the ABA is restrained from proceeding to allocate the licence.

The Federal Couurt is expected to hear the matter beginning i in March of next year.

ABA ggives Broadcast Operations (one month

The ABA has issued a notice to Broadcast Operations Pty Limited under section 141 of the Broadcasting S Services Act, directing it to commence operatition of a commercial radio service in Maryboorough/Hervey Bay, Queensland within one month.

On 21 January 1999, the ABA allocated Broadcast Operatitions Pty Ltd a commercial radio broadcastingg licence to serve Maryborough/Henryey Bay on 103.5MHz. Broadcast Operatitions Pty Ltd had paid \$700 000 for the lilicence at auction in late 1998.

The Broadcasting Services Act requires a licensee to commence a commercial service within one year obf being allocated the licence or within such longer period as is notified in writing by the ABBA.

Broadcast Operations Pty Ltd did not commence the service by 21 January 2000. The ABA granted two o extensions of time, the first to 21 July 2000 and tithe second until 20 October 2000.

On 17 October 22000 the ABA received an application from I Broadcast Operations Pty Ltd

seeking an extension of the commencement of service until 21 February 2001. The ABA decided not to grant any further extension.

The ABA is satisfied that Broadcast Operations has not commenced its service and therefore is in breach of the condition of the licence set out in paragraph 8(1)(h) of Schedule 2 to the Act.

Failure to comply with the ABA's notice by the required date (9 December 2000) may result in Broadcast Operations being prosecuted under section 142 of the Act and/or having its licence suspended or cancelled under section 143 of the Act.

The ABA has since been advised that Broadcast Operations commenced a service within the required time.

Pay TV licences to C7

The ABA has allocated six subscription television broadcasting licences to C7 Pty Limited.

C7 has indicated that it proposes to deliver a range of programming including drama, documentary, general entertainment, art, information and sport.

Guidelines for telephone sex services

The ABA recently approved *Guidelines for Telephone Sex Services*, which summarise its role under Part 9A of the *Telecommunications (Consumer Protection and Service Standards) Act 1999.* The guidelines provide information about the definition of 'telephone sex service', and are intended to assist telephone sex service providers and carriage service providers comply with the law.
