

Proposed changes to radio services in the Remote North East Zone licence area

The ABA is proposing to make channels available for the commercial radio service 4RBL Remote North East Zone to operate at Inglewood, Stanthorpe and Texas in Queensland and and to make revised technical specifications available to commercial radio service 4BRZ Remote North East Zone to operate at Inglewood and Stanthorpe.

The ABA is also proposing to make three additional community radio services available in the Remote North East Zone licence area: at Weipa, Queensland; Dunedoo, New South Wales and the Warrumbungle area of New South Wales (Coonabarabran, Coonamble and Gilgandra). It is also proposing an additional open narrowcasting service to serve the Inglewood area.

The ABA's views are contained in its revised draft variation to the licence area plan for radio for the Remote North East Zone, released on 29 October.

'Before making a final decision on these matters, the ABA is interested in receiving comments on the proposals in the draft variation,' said Professor Flint.

The revised draft variation follows consideration of further requests from Rebel Radio Network Pty Ltd (RRN), the licensee of the commercial radio services in the Remote North East Zone, for alternate technical specifications for its services in Inglewood, Stanthorpe and Texas. Submissions from aspirant community groups to make additional community radio services available in the Remote North East Zone include:

• the Cape Care Association has requested that a

community radio licence be made available to serve Weipa

- Talbragar Broadcasters Inc. has requested that a community radio licence be made available to serve Dunedoo
- and Warrumbungle Community Broadcasters Association Inc. has requested that a community radio licence be made available to serve the Warrumbungle area (Coonabarabran, Coonamble and Gilgandra).

The ABA has received a request to make a high power open narrowcasting service available in the Inglewood region.

Applications invited for new community radio licences

The ABA is seeking applications for new community radio broadcasting licences for the Glen Innes, Lismore and Murwillumbah areas of New South Wales.
