

BUSINESS PROTECTION:

- Locks:
- Doors with glass panels should have a lock that must be opened with a key from both sides.
- Keep key security. Change locks after you have discharged an employee with a key.
- Locks won't work unless you use them be sure to lock up carefully every night.

Crime is a thief's business. Prevention is yours. If you see crime - report it.






