# **MAJOR INTERNATIONAL DRUG** IMPORTATION STOPPED

The AFP made raids and arrests in Sydney on Friday, October 21, in connection with an alleged attempt to import 43.5 kilograms of high grade heroin from Hong Kong. This intelligence was developed from the AFP's overseas liaison officer network. The operation was a particularly protracted one in close cooperation with the Royal Hong Kong Police. Following the AFP's action the RHKP conducted similar raids and at the time of going to press the AFP had charged seven people and 13 were charged in Hong Kong.

The Justice Minister, Senator Michael Tate, wrote to the Commissioner as follows:

#### 25 October 1988

#### My Dear Commissioner

Following the weekend's highly successful completion to the joint Australian Federal Police - Royal Hong Kong police operation, I wish to place on record my congratulations to the AFP in general, and, in particular, to the team of officers directly involved.

As I have publicly stated, the operation was a first class example of the new direction in which you have been taking the Australian Federal Police in the ongoing battle against organised crime and drug trafficking in particular. The level of international and inter-agency co-operation was, to my mind, a most satisfying aspect.

I would be pleased if you would pass on to Assistant Commissioner Peter Lamb and the officers of the International Division, and in particular, Detective Inspector Cliff Foster, my personal congratulations for the fine work displayed through the many long months of the operation. You might also convey my congratulations to the liaison officers in Manila, Bangkok and Hong Kong who were deeply involved in its success.

I am delighted that this major success has been given the credit it deserves and I am sure that the praise will be an inspiration to the dedicated men and women of the Australian Federal Police.
