year at the the 1994 Police Photographic Awards by taking out
the prizes for best overall photograph, best police community
relations photograph, second in
the general category and merit
certificates in police work and
police community relations.

The competition attracted 328 entries which were viewed by thousands of visitors to the National Science and Technology Centre during the Canberra Festival held in March.

Just over half of the entries were in the General Category while entries in the Police Community Relations outnumbered the entries Police Work category by around 20 photographs.

The Exhibition was held in conjunction with the Commissioners

Conference of Australasia and the South West Pacific which was hosted in Canberra by the AFP.

Entries were received from police services from all Australian states, New Zealand, and Papua New Guinea. AFP entries came from ACT, Eastern and Southern Regions.

On the judging panel were: Mr Gordon Bailey, photography lecturer at the Canberra Institute of Technology; Mr Brian McNamara, director of the Forensic Photo Service; and Mr Graham Tidy, Chief Photographer at the Canberra Times.

The Commissioners and guests attended an evening viewing of the exhibition. Addressing the group on behalf of the judging panel, Mr McNamara praised the standard of photography, but suggested that future entrants

take the time to study as many photographic exhibitions as possible to get an understanding of what makes a good picture.

He said that while most entries showed good composition and technical execution, many of the images were of predictable subject matter.

Commissioner McAulay thanked the judges for their efforts and then presented the perpetual trophies. The trophies, provided by a number of photographic industry sponsors, were accepted by the appropriate commissioners on behalf of the various category winners.

In closing, Commissioner McAulay thanked the sponsors whose continued support had made the event possible.






