Two ACT Region members assumed duties on the Australian external territory Christmas Island in the Indian Ocean recently while a third will join them this month, and a fourth in January.


The officers will replace four others, from the team of 10 sworn members, who have completed their two year posting to the island.

The Christmas Island team has a wide range of responsibilities including community policing, regulatory functions such as immigration, motor vehicle registration, licensing and customs, search and rescue, as well as investigations into national functions such as drug importation. The members are assisted by two AFP staff members and several special members appointed from the local community to help with immigration and customs functions at the airport. The superintendent is required at times to perform duties as police prosecutor.

Located about 360km south of Jakarta, the island has a population varying between 1500 to 2000, comprising people of Chinese, Malay and European descent and has a casino which is a popular tourist attraction.
