

# SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Garth Nettheim visited Adelaide for several days in July. He reports:

"The visit was useful for several reasons:

- (i) I was able to establish or maintain direct contact between ALRU and a number of excellent poeple;
- (ii) I had useful discu sions about field officer training with the Director and Administrator of the Aboriginal Land Rights Movement and the Acting Regional Director of DAA;
- (iii) I arranged for a local co-principal for proposed research on land rights law in South Australia;
- (iv) I developed collaboration with Dr. Heather McRae who is teaching Aborigines and the Law at the Law School;
  - (v) In conjunction with Heather McRae and James Crawford, I helped to lay the groundwork for an Aboriginal Law and Policy Interest Group in South Australia."
