House Economics Committee report on Reserve Bank

Twice a year the Governor of the Reserve Bank of Australia, Mr Ian Macfarlane, appears before the House of Representatives Committee on Economics, Finance and Public Administration to discuss the Bank's semi-annual statement. The House Economics Committee provides an important, high profile, mechanism for accountability in the Bank's administration of monetary policy. The Committee's report on the Bank's semi-annual statement for November 1999 and the Bank's 1998/99 annual report will be tabled in Parliament in March 2000. Regional Services Committee report on regional infrastructure and development

A major committee report on infrastructure and the development of Australia's regional areas is expected to be released on 13 March 2000. The report will present the findings and recommendations of the House of Representatives Committee on Primary Industries and Regional Services. Indigenous health inquiry nearing completion

Findings on three treaties to be released in March

On 6 March 2000, the Joint Parliamentary Committee on Treaties will table a report that details the results of its review into three treaty actions:

- an agreement with Singapore on the use of the Shoalwater Bay (Defence) training area;
- a development cooperation treaty with Papua New Guinea; and
- the Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants.

Four reports expected from Public Accounts and Audit Committee

The Joint Committee of Public Accounts and Audit is due to release four new reports by May 2000. These reports are on the following matters:

- review of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997* and the *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*;
- review of two Auditor-General's reports covering issues across various Commonwealth Government Departments; and
- the Public Accounts and Audit Committee's annual activities.
