APLA - New Constitution and By Laws

F ollowing resolutions passed late last year and earlier this year, APLA has altered its structure.

The new structure is that of a company limited by guarantee, under the Corporations Law.

The change was implemented because the new structure appeared more appropriate, particularly as APLA operates across a number of state and territory boundaries

The new constitution and by laws are both available for viewing on the website.

The transitional provisions appoint the existing APLA national council members as directors.

The election process has been altered slightly with elections (by postal ballot) scheduled so that the office bearers (president, vice president, secretary and treasurer) will hold office over each financial year.

The by laws set out the election procedures.

As before, each branch will appoint persons to the national council. Representation is now proportionate with

branches appointing between one and four councillors depending upon their number of full members.

Although the various branches are not separately incorporated, it is intended that the branches adhere, as much as possible, to the constitution and by laws.
