QUEENSLAND CIVIL JUSTICE AWARD

Two Queensland lawyers, who helped to free a man wrongfully detained and gave cause for Australians to ponder the very fabric of their own human rights, were presented with the Australian Lawyers Alliance Queensland Civil Justice Award on 14 February 2009.

Stephen Keim SC, of Higgins Chambers, and Peter Russo, of Russo Lawyers, were jointly awarded the prize for skilled legal work in representing Gold Coast medical registrar, Dr Mohamed Haneef, who faced terrorism-related charges in 2007.
