# The making of the Manual

The Australian librarian's manual project is now at the halfway mark. Volume 1, Documents, appeared last December, and judging by the comments I have received so far, it is already proving its worth. The final manuscript of volume 2, Legislation, is now being teased into shape by a book designer and a copy editor, and is scheduled for publication in December this year.

Volume 3, *Glossary*, is now on the stocks, with a tentative publication date of December 1984. The final volume is in many ways the most ambitious of the three, attempting to record uniquely Australian library terms, the names of specific Australian collections, library-related organisations and institutions, Australian publications in librarianship (particularly serials).

To make this volume anywhere near successful, a lot of research will be necessary, and a lot of reliance upon colleagues around Australia to make this as full an Australian library glossary as possible. I am looking forward to preparing this challenging work and to the spontaneous and solicited co-operation which I know will be given by fellow Australian librarians.

# Computer courses at Toorak/ South Yarra Library

A community access computer scheme has been introduced at the Toorak/South Yarra Branch of the Prahran City Libraries. The Computer Education Group of Victoria (CEGV) has installed in the library eight Apple 2e Computers on which are run special courses designed to give children and adults a basic understanding of programming techniques.

Courses are run during the day for classes from local primary schools and after school for individual children. The courses are based on a simple yet highly sophisticated computer language, LOGO. The child learns to control movements of a turtle-shaped robot around the screen to draw graphics. This not only teaches the child something about computers but also about involvement and movement.

During the evening courses are run for adults where they can either do a course to familiarise themselves with computers by learning LOGO or they can learn to program in the language BASIC. A heavy demand is coming from adults who realise computers will be playing an ever-increasing role in our daily lives and want to learn how they function.

Tutors are provided for all courses by the CEGV and a charge of \$30.00 is made for each course. It is intended that the computers will become available outside class times.
