A project to develop educational libraries in the Solomon Islands is being funded by the World Bank as a part of the Primary Edu-

cation Development Project.

Joe Hallein, Senior Lecturer and Co-ordinator of Post Graduate Programs in the School of Library and Information Studies at Kuring-gai College of Advanced Education, has been appointed Library Consultant for the project. He will be responsible for the establishment of the Library at the Solomon Islands Teachers College; assisting in the development of provincial educational resource centres; conduct of inservice training courses for educational resource personnel and teaching trainees; training counterpart staff.

'Meet the Author' Programme

The Australian Library Promotion Council, in co-operation with the Literature Board of the Australian Council is once again offering grants for the highly successful 'Meet the Author' programme.

The purpose of the grants is to enable school and public libraries to develop a programme to encourage the community to meet with and become aware of Australian authors and literature. Such programmes attract new borrowers to the library and help make the library a focal point for the community.

Awards of up to \$400 are made available to help fund these projects. Applications should include the proposed venue and author, publicity plans and a budget.

Applicants are expected to meet the following conditions — an Australian author must be involved, applicants must be able to demonstrate a level of commitment of their organisation to the programme and an appropriate speaker's fee and expenses is available to the author. The closing date for submission of applications is 30 June 1983.

The New Minister for Communications, Mr Michael Duffy, has indicated that the change of Government will not mean any reduction of support for the activities planned in Australia to commemorate World Communications Year 1983.

The latest bulletin from the Department of Communications includes some further information about events relating to WCY to take place later this year.

From 29 June to 1 July, there will be an International Conference on Tertiary Education for the Age of Communications, organised by the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology; from 11-12 July there will be an Organisational Communications Seminar, organised by Warrnambool Institute of Advanced Education, and from 13-15 July there will be a Communications and Government Seminar at Canberra CAE.

Events so far scheduled for the remaining months of the year include a Law and Technology Seminar in Brisbane during Information Technology Week in August; the IREECON International in Sydney from 5-9 September, and, in November, a conference on Education and Communications Technology organised by the Educational Technology Centre of SA.


