Some readers may have all the answers, but it's likely that a few are still puzzling over the Whitlam library.

Which is not really surprising as it has been the official name of the former Fairfield City Library only since last November. It is an excellent choice, as the library owes much to the Whitlam years and is now one of the state's finest, located in an attractive, functional building designed by no less than Harry Seidler.

The library was officially named the Whitlam library in a ceremony at which Mr Gough Whitlam also launched their splendidly produced local history, Fairfield — a history of the district written by local archivist Vance George. Beautifully bound and full of fascinating photographs, it costs only \$15 and is available from the Whitlam library (02) 609 0358.

# Nothing CLANN destine about this!

The CLANN Reciprocal Borrowing Scheme for Libraries in NSW was launched in March 1982. By Christmas almost all CLANN members had signed up. Most participating institutions are colleges, but two government departments and one public library give the scheme a heterogeneous character.

Nominations for membership of non-CLANN members will be considered.

The designers of the CLANN scheme are indebted to its precursors in Victoria and Queensland. The CLANN version involves libraries in a minimum of extra record-keeping. All a borrower generally needs in order to register with a participating institution is a current ID card from his or her home institution. (Members may insist on further documentation if they wish, but few have exercised this option).


Borrowers must live by the rules of host institutions, which are free to impose special terms of use on outside borrowers. To date the scheme has encountered only very minor problems, and aroused a surprisingly high level of interest. One large library signed up over 150 reciprocal borrowers in the first 5 months.

A directory of participating institutions is now available. Some members plan to distribute copies to all registered borrowers, and this should encourage even wider use of the scheme.

This initiative illustrates CLANN's willingness to involve intself in ventures of library co-operation not necessarily involving automation.
