

Applications are invited for the position of Librarian for a Pilot Study of a new approach to Continuing Medical Education in Central Queensland to be conthe Medical Board of ducted by Queensland.

Applicants must possess a degree from a recognized tertiary institution.

The pilot study will be based at Rockhampton Hospital and will contain a small library, a terminal for access to Medlars and other data bases, a microcomputer and audio-visual teaching aids. Training in techniques of database access will be provided if required.

The study will be controlled by a Medical Co-ordinator and the Librarian will be the only other staff member.

The position of Librarian is a challenging one, as the Study involves the building up of an innovative approach to Continuing Medical Education based on new knowledge and modern technology. Duties will include assisting the Co-ordinator in designing and managing the information services in the Centre to meet practitioners' needs, and evaluating their effectiveness: establishing and maintaining computerised library files; assisting in the preparation of educational programmes and reports and performing secretarial duties for the Co-ordinator. The appointee will be responsible for the operations of the Centre when the Medical Coordinator is away travelling through the area. Keyboard skills are essential.
