ABN Conference Papers published

The National Library of Australia has pubished the papers and proceedings of the irst Australian Bibliographic Network ABN) conference, held recently in Melbourne.

Described by the Director-General of the National Library (Mr Harrison Bryan) as the most significant initiative that the National Library has taken, and will be ikely ever to take, in its service to the nation', ABN is an automated network which provides a bibliographic service for nost of Australia's State, university, government, hospital and other important ibraries. It is a resource-sharing network, nany of the member libraries contributing nformation to its data base.

Because of the relatively early stage of development of ABN (it was established by the National Library in 1981), the conference concentrated on forward plans for the network, problems associated with linking State or smaller computerised systems to the network, and extension of the network's lata base to include art works, manuscripts, maps, films and other non-book materials neld by libraries.

Speakers represented a wide range of institutions participating in the network and neluded library managers, computer company representatives, members of network committees, cataloguers and systems officers.

Each group of papers in the published report is followed by a summary of the discussion which took place after their presentation. The book is obtainable from the Sales and Subscriptions Section, National Library of Australia, Canberra 2600 at \$10, post free.

A new look at press releases

A new monthly newsletter is being produced to take the place of individual press releases.

The publishers say that the newsletter, called *News Breaks*, is more cost efficient. It is a collection of news value editorial stories mailed on a monthly basis to 1500 registered senior journalists at every TV and radio station, every capital city, country and suburban newspapers, as well as most consumer and trade magazines.

News Breaks, which the publishers commend as a useful means of communication about products, services, people, etc, is used by public relations consultants; advertising agencies, and marketing/service companies.


