licroCAIRS get the numbers

vo of the big eight accounting firms are aking increasing use of the automated libry system, microCAIRS, of their accounting id, now their other libraries, say Systematics. rthur Anderson & Co and Coopers & Lyand both installed microCAIRS in their counting libraries in 1984, AA&Co in Melnurne and Coopers in Sydney. During 1985 oth extended their use of the information reieval and other facilities in the software by stalling duplicate databases in other offices, A&Co in Perth and Brisbane and Coopers so in Brisbane.

Recently both have extended the use of icroCAIRS to their management consulting praries in Sydney. AA&Co have also included eir Sydney accounting library in their netork and the four offices (Brisbane, Melpurne, Perth & Sydney) have access to the Although the transfer of information has not yet extended overseas both of these firms have installed microCAIRS in their London offices and, with the ease of data transfer available with the software, it is probably only a matter of time before the cataloguing load will be shared between these and many more offices.

The Continuing Legacy

In 1986 Sydney Legacy will be celebrating their Diamond Jubilee, part of which includes Legacy Week -31 August to 5 September. It is 40 years since the end of World War II and ten years since the end of Vietnam. But Legacy is very much still a growing organisation.

Roy Morris, President of Sydney Legacy said that there are currently over 100,000 widows and 7,000 children being cared for by Legacy in Australia, and numbers are not expected to peak until around 1997.

Legacy is a solely Australian organisation pledged to help those widows and children of men who served overseas in wartime.

JOINT STEERING COMMITTEE FOR REVISION OF AACR AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVE Call for Nominations

The Australian Committee on Cataloguing (ACOC) hereby calls for nominations for the position of Australian representative on the Joint Steering Committee for Revision of AACR. The position will be for a three year term, from January 1987 – December 1989. Only financial members of the Library Association of Australia are eligible to nominate.

The Joint Steering Committee (JSC) for Revision of AACR comprises, in addition to the representative from Australia, representatives of the Library of Congress, the American Library Association, the British Library, the Library Association (Great Britain), the Canadian Committee on Cataloguing and the editors of AARC2. Its function is to consider proposals for changes to the Anglo-American Cataloguing Rules, submitted by the represented bodies, and to decide on the final form of any rule changes. JSC is also charged with the duty of reviewing the need for amendments and revision of AACR2 in the light of representations from users of the text.

The Australian representative will become an ex-officio member of the Australian Committee on Cataloguing and will be required to attend meetings of the Committee. These meetings are held twice per year. The representative will also be required to attend meetings of JSC which are held once per year, normally in August or September, and usually in North America or Britain.

Nominations should be submitted in writing, with evidence of the consent of the nominee. Members of the Association may nominate themselves. A seconder is not required. Nominations should be accompanied by a statement outlining the nominee's background and reasons for wishing to serve as the Australian representative.
