hear? Which libraries or information services do they see value in visiting? And so on.

It is often said that you get out of anything what you put into it. It is also clear that representatives of groups need to be in touch with the people they represent. I believe that our Head Office staff are doing all they can to ease the process of communication within the Association, and it is up to us as members to use what is available to the full. If what is available is not satisfactory, we need to explore further means of overcoming the difficulties. Let's aim to keep the lines of communication open at all times.

ALIA Press — a promising future

dvertising for, and - it is hoped—speedy filling of, the key position of Manager, ALIA Press, was the highest priority that emerged from the 11 May meeting of the Publications Board.

ALIA Executive Director, Sue Kosse, reported that the position was being advertised immediately in book trade and national publications, including

The Board identified many major issues that the new Manager will need to address. In the meantime, Kerry Webb and Peter Clayton are preparing a position paper on the way in which ALIA Press, the commercial publishing arm of the Association, is likely to operate.

In the pipeline

There are many publications already in the pipeline, among them The new classics, an international guide to awardwinning children's literature; and Anne Casey's Dorothy Hewett, an outstanding bibliographic guide to this remarkable Australian writer.

Vivienne Sigley's fascinating Australian mottoes will soon be going to the printer, as will the third edition of the Australian dictionary of acronyms and abbreviations, which is about 50 per cent bigger than the last (1981) edition. Finishing touches are being put to the second volume of Harrison Bryan's ALIAS (Australia's library, information and archives services — an encyclopaedia of practice and practitioners). The Board also

noted good progress with the collection of data for the Researcher's guide to audiovisual resources in Australia, and other proposed publications were discussed.

Some of the resolutions from the Australian Libraries Summit relating to preservation and library materials for people with disabilities had been referred to the Board for action or comment. The Board pledged its support for the bodies charged with seeing these resolutions through.

Permanent paper


The Board noted its long and active involvement in the promotion of the use of permanent paper: it has already initiated a seminar on the topic and is itself publishing works (notably ALIAS) using permanent paper. The Board noted a forthcoming New South Wales Branch seminar on the issue. Pat Ward reported that a revised edition of the highly successful publication Stopping the rot was in preparation, and that the companion video was selling well.

The new production arrangements for InCite were noted, and the Board resolved to recommend to General Council that a current index to InCite be produced. This would be available to members at a nominal cost. The Board will also test the market for a retrospective index to InCite.
