



### **BLS** joins Blockwell

B.H. Blackwell and James Bennett Library Services (JBLS) report that acquisition formalities are complete and JBLS is now a member of the Blackwell group of library supply companies.

Although JBLS will continue to operate independently of the existing Blackwell organisation in Australia, it will now have available all the resources of an international group of companies.

Chris von Hinckeldey, who became General Manager of Mannings Library Services in September 1988, has been appointed Managing Director of JBLS, taking over from Patrick Gleeson, who has resigned.

The operations of Mannings will be consolidated with those of JBLS in Collaroy over the next few weeks and the two companies merged.

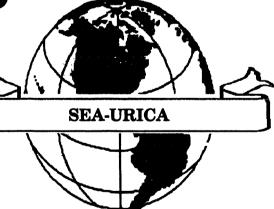

# Only 17 days 10 go ...

ost will probably not need reminding that the 5th National Library Technicians' Conference will be held at the Conrad International Hotel at Broadbeach, on Queensland's Gold Coast, on Thursday and Friday 27 and 28 July. The Conference is an opportunity for library technicians to contemplate their achievements and consider their future in the library and information profession.

### Conference program

The Conference program, which will be preceded by a cocktail party and opening of the trade exhibition on Wednesday evening, will cover a wide range of topics of interest to members of the library and information industry.

Highlights include Thursday's opening address by Dr Josf Trace (Chairman, Library Board of Queensland) and the keynote address by Eric Wainwright (Chairman of the ALIA Board of Education and Deputy Director of the National Library of Australia).

As the Conference falls during National Book Week, print materials will be the focus of papers presented by Elizabeth Carvosso (Bennett-EBSCO), Ian Tucker (Australian Manager, Ulverscroft Large Print Books) and Susan Bridge (Lawyer for the Australian Copyright Council). Susan's paper will provide information on, and explanation of, current copyright legislation.

On Friday morning, attention will turn to industrial affairs, beginning with a paper by Allan Ebert (Queensland Department of Industrial Affairs) on the Library Technicians' Award in the Queensland Public Service. The morning will conclude with a panel discussion by State representatives, who will outline recent industrial developments in their respective States. Their presentations will be followed by an open forum in which participation by delegates will be encouraged.

### Registration

It is not too late to register and become part of this significant Conference. Oneday registration is available at a cost of \$105 per person per day for Thursday and Friday. This includes entry to all Conference sessions for the day plus morning and afternoon teas, lunch, conference materials and entry to the trade exhibition.

Intending 1-day delegates may register at the conference desk from 8 am on the day.

#### Trade exhibition

The Conference Convener reports that Australian and overseas library suppliers and library equipment and storage companies will be contributing to set up a quality trade exhibition. Do take time to say hello to the exhibitors and, of course, to ALIA staff at the exhibition.

### Social program

For people arriving and registering on Wednesday night, there is a welcome cocktail party and the opening of the trade exhibition. On Thursday evening, delegates can join a Seaworld tour, including dinner, or take advantage of the Hotel facilities.

The highlight of the social program will be the Gala Dinner on Friday evening, at which Averill Edwards, 1989 President of ALIA, will be Guest Speaker. Major events of the evening will be a reunion of Past Presidents of the Library Technicians' Section; the celebration of the 10th anniversary of the National Library Technicians' Section; and the presentation of the inaugural Library Technician of the Year Award — sponsored by Auslib Press — by Alan Bundy.

## CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Membership of the Board of Education is as follows:

The retiring members have all completed two terms with the Board and are **not** therefore eligible for reelection.
