### sing ABN for ILL

Ask any interlibrary loan officer, and they will tell you that ABN is the place to go for location information. However, sometimes ABN has insufficient locations to service an interlibrary loan request. Either there are no locations, or the locations available are not the most convenient.

If you should find yourself in this situation, help is at hand in the form of the Insufficient Locations Project. Report the serial title to the ABN Office, where it will be searched in the serial catalogues of major libraries which do not themselves contribute holdings to ABN. The ABN Office's collection of serial catalogues includes those of the Australian National University, CLANN, the University of New England, the University of Queensland, Griffith University, James Cook University of North Queensland, the Capricornia Institute, the Darling Downs Institute of Advanced Education, the University of Tasmania and La Trobe University.

If additional holdings are found, they are added to ABN under the special union catalogue symbol ZNUC. If no additional holdings are found, the report is passed on to the National Library of Australia's selection staff who

#### The right to read

The National Library of Australia is arranging a national seminar in 1990, the International Year of Literacy. Entitled 'The right to read', it will be focussing on the need for specially pro-

duced library materials for people with reading problems due to a developmental, intellectual or learning-related disability or deafness acquired before language development.

Very little material is produced or available for people with language and literacy limitations. Material that does exist is mainly targeted at reluctant adolescent readers or at people who are in the process of learning to read.

The National Library hopes that the seminar will attract participation by authors, publishers, librarians, experts in the literacy and special education fields and speech pathologists, as well as people with disabilities themselves.
