Libraries seek overseas markets

Sue Kosse describes an important international initiative

THE CONCEPT OF a coordinated Australian approach to gaining international projects in the library and information services field was given strong endorsement at a meeting of 75 people in Albury-Wodonga in September 1992.

The meeting, convened by a group calling itself Australian Library and International Information Services (ALIIS), saw ALIIS as taking on a clearing-house role to coordinate and disseminate information relating to international consulting opportunities, gathering data on institutional and individuals' experience and skills, and promoting existing linkages between libraries and librarians in Australia and the Asia and Pacific region.

Initially representatives of the International Development

Program of Australian Universities and Colleges (IDP), the ANU Library, the National Library of Australia and ALIA will act as the steering group to translate the concept of ALIIS into action. IDP will provide the secretariat support in the first year.

The first activities of ALIIS have already begun with the issuing of an opportunities bulletin outlining consulting opportunities in Kuwait and the People's Republic of China. ALIIS has also begun the development of a register of Australian expertise.
