SA Branch demonstrates a commitment

Last month the SA Branch convened a public meeting to draw attention to the funding crisis facing all types of libraries, which is eroding access to information. We particularly wanted to highlight the cuts in the opening hours of the State Library of SA. With a State election imminent, it was an opportune time to publicise our dissatisfaction that the State Library has the most limited operating hours of any major Australian library.

We also wanted to emphasise that underfunding one major library deleteriously impacts on other

libraries that are themselves overburdened and under resourced.

The public meeting received much media coverage and attracted an attendance of almost two hundred. The meeting started on a musical note. Pat Wilson, librarian by training but now star of radio and stage, sang three songs she composed especially for the meeting. Then the Hon. Diana Laidlaw, representing the Opposition, promised that if elected the Liberal Party would ensure that the State Library stays open until 8pm for an extra 4 nights a week. The Minister, Anne Levy, believed that informa-

tion technology would solve most access problems...

What did the meeting achieve? We passed resolutions calling for longer opening hours for the State Library, and an assessment of the resources available for the library services in SA. We believe that the meeting succeeded in placing the issue of library funding on the political agenda and gave media exposure to the plight of our libraries.

The resolutions passed by meeting will be distributed to all politicians and pressure will be maintained to ensure that the Minister acts on them.
