

## New copier breaks colour barrier

An Australian design gives cost-effective B&W or colour copies from the same machine

Libraries that offer copying facilities are increasingly under pressure to provide colour photocopiers. This has generally meant another machine, which occupies space, requires a separate contract and possibly different paper stocks—all additional costs and complexity.

Langley Park Manufacturing of Sydney has now developed and marketed its PACCC3 colour copier which not only makes two grades of colour copies on plain paper but also makes B&W copies at B&W prices. Operating costs are very reasonable and virtually independent of paper size: only 2¢ per page up to A3 for B&W, 30¢ for standard colour and 60¢ for 'photo quality' colour. These should enable any library to recover its costs (or make a handsome profit) while still charging only quite modest prices.

Apart from its unique versatility, this machine runs at good speeds: in

B&W it can make 15 A3 or 30 A4 copies a minute, and in full colour between 3 and 5 copies a minute depending on the quality.

The control panel and instructions are straightforward—one happy library user was heard to say, 'At last, a colour copier that doesn't need a pilot's licence to work it!' It provides five fixed reductions from 93% to 50%, and four enlargements from 115% to 200%. It comes complete with a coin unit and can be fitted with a debit/credit card facility.
