ment requires a major rethinking about the ways in which libraries can usefully provide access to information and literary and imaginative work.

Annelise Mark Pejtersen from Denmark will be the keynote speaker on Saturday. Annelise's address will outline the Book House's successful new approach to the provision of subject access in online catalogues, with special emphasis being placed on the work involved in utilising empirical studies of user behaviour in the library.

Jane Leahy, the conference convenor, and all the committee members look forward to seeing you in Fremantle in November.
