## First meeting and 1993 priorities

The Board of Education held its first meeting for 1993 at the ALIA National Office on 8–9 February. Kay Poustie was elected as the new Chair, with Associate Professor Joyce Kirk as Deputy. Margaret Findlay is Convener of the Training and Development Committee (TDC) and Anne Hazell is Convener of the Professional Standards Committee (PSC).

At each meeting the Board reviews its priorities. For 1993 these priorities are:

### Ongoing tasks

- (i) monitoring of and response to outside issues within the terms of reference of the Board of Education;
- (ii) course recognition visits and annual returns;
- (iii) monitoring of course recognition documentation;
- (iv) publicity for the Board;
- (v) teleconferences, training and development services;
- (vi) awards.
- (iv) awards—review of criteria;
- (v) review of criteria for Category 2 assessment of qualifications (PSC);
- (vi) review of education statements.

### High Priority

- (i) Continuing Professional Development Working Party (PSC);
- (ii) Analysis of Training and Development needs and opportunities (TDC);
- (iii) Course Recognition Procedures Review (PSC);
