Feasibility study underway

feasibility study for the development of CILLA: The Co-ordinated Interlibrary Loan Administration Project is now underway. Judith Greenaway, document delivery librarian at Monash University has been seconded to the project and will complete the study by February next

The project was first proposed by Judith Greenaway, Geoff Payne (CAVAL Ltd) and Neil McLean (Macquarie University) and arose out of the need to provide a local interlibrary loan and document delivery administration system which would handle the complex interlending management environment inherent in all such operations.

The project will be undertaken in close association with the National Document and Information Service team and the Joint Electronic Document Delivery Software project. This close association with other major Australian developments is to ensure that all systems will inter-operate efficiently. Mary Jackson, Access and Delivery Services Consultant, Association of Research Libraries will act as external adviser to the project.

The feasibility study has been funded by a grant from the AVCC's National Priority (Reserve) Fund, Improved Information Infrastructure Program 2(a), supplemented by additional funds from the Australian Council of Libraries and Information Services, with administrative support provided by CAVAL
