

Calling Western Australian writers

he Library and Information Service of Western Australia (LISWA) is calling for entries to the 1998 Western Australian Premier's Book Awards. To be eligible, works must have been published, or in the case of scripts, have had their first professional production, between 1 October 1997 and 30 September 1998. Entry is open to writers who were born in Western Australia, whose usual place of residence is Western Australia, who were resident in the state for a minimum of ten years at some stage although not currently a resident, or whose work has Western Australia as its primary focus. Closing date for entries is 30 September 1998.

There are six categories in the awards being fiction; poetry; historical and critical studies; children's and young adults; special; and script.
