Keeping the art of storytelling alive in Queensland

he Storytelling Guild of Tropical North Queensland is up and running. A consortium of libraries in Tropical North Queensland applied for and won a Library Innovation/Project grant to finance the Guild.

Briefly the aims of the Guild are:

- to promote storytelling for all ages and cultures within the community:
- to encourage people to tell stories and develop their skills in the art of storytelling;
- to produce a newsletter to keep members informed of relevant events;
- to produce booklists and bibliographies to assist storytellers;
- to produce a directory of storytellers; and
- to organise activities such as storytelling festivals, seminars, workshops and informal gatherings.

The first meeting of the guild was held at Cairns City Library on 26 April. At this meeting the committee was elected. Lee Finkelstein is president, Karen Seymour, secretary and Karen Waltham, treasurer. Other committee members are Joan Anderson and Frances Utzinger.

In a morning workshop on Saturday 15 August 1998, Zoe Robb the founder of the Storytelling Guild of New South Wales talked about storytelling techniques for all ages. The workshop entitled 'Put me in the picture' was the first event hosted by the guild. Zoe, an experienced and inspiring storyteller, will be spending some time in the North, storytelling in some remote libraries.

At 10am on Saturday 24 October, at Smithfield Library, the Guild will be launched by Sydney puppeteer, Dennis Murphy and his famous puppet, Lady Hortense. Dennis has recently returned from a International Theatre Festival for Children held at Porto Sant'elpildo, Italy. Lady Hortense, coming out of retirement for the occasion, is wellknown for her attendance at public functions of this kind. In the afternoon Dennis, together with various experienced storytellers in the Guild will conduct a workshop for experienced and beginner storytellers. Having attended many of Dennis' workshops I can highly recommend this event.
