Developing online networks

AFE (VET) library staff around Australia now have access to a range of online communication strategies, thanks to an ANTA project called 'Developing online networks'. These strategies include a facility for sharing files, a discussion forum, web chat facilities and a mailing list. There are also hints on useful software for online networking and a help button.

The ANTA project was carried out by a consortium which included staff from RMIT Carlton (VET) Library, with the brief of determining effective strategies for establishing online networks using a case study approach. The project team worked with seven groups in VET in Australia, including teachers writing curriculum, private provider consortiums, adult and community education providers, industry training advisory boards and library staff. The national working group for TAFE library services worked in

collaboration with the project team to nominate library staff volunteers from all states, who were then trained in the use of online strategies. This pilot group were then encouraged to utilise these strategies to exchange information and discuss issues of concern to VET libraries.

Feedback from these volunteers indicated that such information exchange and discussion was particularly valuable, and the national working group has now recommended that the communications strategies be made available to TAFE library staff around Australia as a valuable mechanism for cross fertilisation of ideas. Leading librarian retires

ennie McCall, director of the Battye Library retired recently. Lennie has made a major contribution to library services in Western Australia. She joined the staff of the State Library Service (now the Library and Information Service of Western Australia) in 1953.

In 1965 Lennie was appointed to the position of divisional librarian of the State Bibliographical Centre, a position she held until 1982. This centre was the first of its kind in Australia and led the

way in the co-ordination of library resources to satisfy readers' requests. Lennie developed and managed the state-wide request and information service, built up the union catalogues and bibliographical stock, and gained the goodwill of those participating.

From 1982–1988 Lennie held the position of principal librarian: public lending services. Her next position was director: corporate services which brought together finance, information technology, human resource

management, preservation services, publications and display, and building services.

Lennie has been an ac-

tive member of ALIA since 1963: she was a member of the Western Australian Branch Council from 1971 to 1983, general councillor from 1977–1979, and president of the Western Australian branch in 1978–79. Lennie has been awarded the Certificate of Recognition for her contribution to the profession in Western Australia.
