Keynote speaker for national cataloguing conference announced

he focus of the national cataloguing conference in Brisbane will be the changing environment in which cataloguing operates. A critical issue facing the cataloguing community is the extent to which our current codes and practices are able to provide access to new types of resources, particularly electronic resources.

The keynote speaker, Tom Delsey, will give two papers. The first, the keynote address, is entitled: 'Unchartered territory: facilitating access to information resources in cyberspace.' The second paper, 'Viewing the information universe through the Anglo American Cataloguing Rules,' will deal with the analysis he has conducted of AACR2 using an entity-relationship methodology.

Tom Delsey is the director general, corporate policy and communications at the National Library of Canada. He has published a number of papers on bibliographic standards and the application of technology to bibliographic control. He served as a consultant for the IFLA Study on Functional Requirements for Bibliographic Records, and has served on a number of international committees and working groups within CONSER, IFLA, ISDS, and ISO.
