

Honour for former state archivist

We are pleased to report that Margaret Medcalf, BA Dip Ed, FALIA, ARMA, former state archivist and principal librarian of the JS Battye Library of West Australia from 1971 to 1989, has received an Order of Australia Medal in the General Division in the June Queen's Birthday Honours for service to the preservation of history.

Margaret's career started in 1955 when she was appointed to the Archives Branch of the Public Library of Western Australia. From 1971 she served in the dual role of state archivist and principal librarian of the Battye Library with the Library and Information Service of Western Australia.

During her professional career she has been involved in many organisations including president of the archives section of the Library Association of Australia (1972–72); inaugural convenor of the Perth branch of the Australian Society of Archivists (1981–85); president of the Australian Library and Information Association, Western Australian branch (1982); and founding member in 1982, and from 1988 to 1989, president of the Western Australian branch of the Records Management Association of Australia. Margaret served as a member of the Western Australian Heritage Committee (1980–1991); and was appointed by the Western Australian government to the Government House Foundation from 1987 through to the mid-1990s.

In recognition of her service and distinguished contribution to librarianship, archives, records management and bibliography she has received the following awards: an ALIA Fellowship in 1986; honorary life member of the Australian Society of Archivists in 1989; honorary life member of the Oral History Association (WA Branch); hon-

orary Associateship of the Western Australian Museum, for her contribution to the Museum's Maritime Archaeology Advisory Committee, and in 1995 she was appointed a Fellow of the Royal Western Australian Historical Society.

In 1989 Margaret was elected to both positions of president and chairman of council of the Royal Western Australian Historical Society. She served in this dual position until 1991, followed by a further three years as chairman of council of that Society.

Margaret is a charter member of Zonta International's Zonta Club of Perth. Zonta International is an international community service organisation of executives in business and the professions and has a worldwide membership of more than 36 000 executives. In Paris, last year she was appointed chairman of Archives and History for Zonta International for 1998–2000. ■
