Director-general of the National Library of Australia announced Jan Fullerton has been appointed director-general of the National Library of Australia. The appointment was announced on 11 August by federal minister for the arts, Peter McGauran. He said 'Ms Fullerton has extensive management experience and a comprehensive understanding of the library, its functions and audiences. This will be a great asset to the library as it takes up the challenges of collecting, preserving and providing access to digital information for all Australians.'

Jan joined the library in 1968 and has played a significant role in various areas including principal librarian, cataloguing, and assistant director-general of the collections and reader services division. She has also acted as both its deputy director-general, and director-general.

National Library Council appointments

Three new members have been appointed to the council of the National Library of Australia. The State Library of South Australia
