Australia Day Medallion for Pam Piper Pam Piper, assistant director of the Defence Library Service (DLS) — BusinessLink was awarded the Department of Defence Australia Day Medallion for her contributions to the provision of library services in Defence and the wider library community in the Australian Capital Territory.

After a number of years with the Department of Education, Pam opted for a career change and joined the Defence Information Service Network Office (DISNO). She managed the integration of the Online Defence

Information Network (ODIN) from the project stage into the functional operations of the library service; co-ordinated the business operations of the library network; and provided leadership for the implementation of two major library reviews.

The final report of the *Defence efficiency* review and the defence reform program recommended that the Department libraries be brought together into a single national library service, with a single management structure, to provide a more effective client-focused service. The service will depart from the traditional physical library service model and provide online access to, and delivery of, information resources. Desktop access, both for accessing information and for the delivery of services will also be provided Australia wide.

DLS has also established a national *Defence Library Research Service* to provide electronic access to customised, relevant and timely information to support the research and development activities of the Department.

Pam has been instrumental in implementing the recommendations of the library review. Her leadership, professionalism and enthusiasm have been vital in the development and implementation of the DLS.
