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CPD – become master of your destiny

In the dynamic environment of the library and information sector one thing remains constant, change. Change can be a threat or an opportunity. It becomes a threat if it is borne out of a fear of the unknown or of losing control of a situation. More importantly though, it can be welcomed as an opportunity if it is anticipated and planned for.

Planning for change involves addressing three fundamental questions:

Where are you?

Where do you want to be?

How are you going to get there?

Planning for change in your career also involves engaging in continuous learning to keep your knowledge, skills and attitudes up to date. In other words, undertaking continuing professional development (CPD).

Until this year, CPD had been treated as the responsibility of the individual. But in January 2000, in response to requests from members, ALIA took a leadership role in this area, with the introduction of a subcategory of membership that recognises the CPD of its members. The scheme encourages participants to plan their career using the *Career Development Kit*, and then undertake the appropriate CPD to meet their personal and professional goals. Mandatory compliance guidelines ensure that the planning process is structured and

Innovation and libraries go hand in hand. Librarians are expected to do more with less, adopt current technologies and justify their usefulness and value.

CAVAL is conducting a full day workshop at their Bundoora offices which will look at innovation in libraries. Presented by David Tan, winner of three ALIA Innovation awards, the workshop will cover topics including: libraries and innovation; innovation models; tools for innovation; and innovative practices in a commercial environment.

The scheme also provides guidance to employers in identifying members who maintain currency in their qualifications.

Participants receive on-going personal assistance from ALIA National Office staff and are encouraged to ask questions and share information with their professional peers via an electronic mailing list dedicated to CPD. The elist was introduced in March and some of the issues discussed have included:

- How best to build CPD hours if you live in a regional or remote area and do not have access to formal training activities;
- What are considered acceptable CPD activities; and
- Distance education opportunities.

At present ALIA is also brokering partnerships with several training providers including CAVAL, AIMA, the University of Canberra and Curtin University of Technology, with the intention of providing a range of CPD activities to ALIA members at a discounted rate.

A survey recently posted to the CPD e-list canvassed the training needs of members in metropolitan and regional areas. The information gained through the survey will be used to guide negotiations with several training providers on the types or activities offered to members, and could influence the location of such training activities.
