Recent staff movements in the library and information sector

Australian Publishers Association Sue Blackwell recently announced her resignation after twelve years as the Australian Publishers Association.

ISA-RoweCom Australia

Janette Wright has been named as the new managing director of ISA-RoweCom. Janette will take up her role in October. Alfred Gans, current general manager, will retire in August 2001. Janette is currently the director of library and community services for Waverley Council in Sydney. She previously directed the public library and network services at the State Library of New South Wales and was an ALIA general councillor.

Special Libraries Association (USA)

David R Bender, the executive director of the Special Libraries Association (SLA) for twenty-one years, recently announced his forthcoming retirement. His retirement will officially begin on 31 July 2001.

During Dr Bender's stewardship, SLA has grown substantially, from a largely North American organisation with an operating budget of less than US\$1 million to a global and virtual association with a US\$9 million operating budget. In 1979, he began his service as executive director of an association of approximately 11 000 information professionals in forty-nine chapters and twenty-nine subject-specific divisions, most of whom worked in the United States. He leaves SLA with nearly 14 000 members in sixty countries, working together in fiftyseven chapters, twenty-five divisions, and twelve interest-related caucuses.

Nan Chauncy award

Dr Belle Alderman from the University of Canberra has been awarded the Nan Chauncy award for outstanding achievements in the field of Australian children's literature, as 'teacher, author, editor, researcher and critic'. Belle's award was presented at the fifth national conference of the Children's Book Council of Australia.

New media arts fund appointments

The appointment of three new members to the Australia Council's New Media Arts Fund were recently announced - Linda Cooper, Dr Nigel Helyer and Peter Hennessey.

Linda Cooper is an exhibition consultant, and was recently a member of the Exhibition Development Working Group for the 2002 Adelaide Festival and feasibility consultant for the South Australian Education Department on the establishment of a new science centre in Adelaide.


Nigel Helyer has participated in numerous national and international exhibitions and undertaken many international artist's residencies. His creative practice includes major environmental works, installation works, broadcast works and sound art, and works in which these artforms converge in multimedia formats.

Mr Sam Lipski has been appointed as the new president of the Library Board of Victoria. Mr Lipski is the twenty-first president of the State Library Board. Past presidents have included Sir Redmond Barry and Sir Keith Murdoch. He replaces Mr Ian Renard who retired in June. Mr Lipski is currently chief executive of the Pratt Foundation, the philanthropic trust of the Pratt family, and editoral chairman of the Australian Jewish News. He is a trustee of the Australian Refugee Foundation and member of the Advisory Committee for the Centre for the Mind at the Australian University and Sydney University. He holds an Order of Australia for his services to the media.
