Computer-based training program

eeting the training needs of a geographically-isolated clientele was the challenge faced by the Queensland Police Service Library Service. An innovative partnership between the Library Services and Teaching and Learning Services of the Queensland Police Service, and utilising the latest information technology, ensured that the challenge was met.

The Queensland Police Service's 'virtual library' allows library clients to access, search and retrieve resources; submit reference requests; make interlibrary loans; submit photocopying request forms; and to access current awareness and information alerts. The Library Service staff provide face-to-face training in the use of the virtual library. However, this is not a viable or effective option when addressing the needs of the library's remote users.

The Library Service team have harnessed information technology to bring the Queensland Police Service together, virtually. The Library Service team created the computer-based train-

ing (CBT) program which can accessed from networked computer within the Queensland Police Service, the intranet. Now, Oueens-Police land Service personnel can undertake a selfpaced online tutorial which teaches them how to max-
