Katie Zepps Nursing Library

The Katie Zepps Nursing Library at the NSW College of Nursing decided to participate in National Simultaneous Storytime this year. Children are definitely not clients of the library service, although we do occasionally have young visitors accompanying their nurse mothers to the library. As a former public library branch librarian (in the distant past), I still had fond memories of weekly storytimes.

An initial approach to several pediatric nurses working at the College met with a positive response so we thought 'Let's do it!' We settled upon taking the storytime out to sick children in hospital rather than running it within the library. A children's ward at King George (part of Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney) was approached and agreed to let us visit on the day. Materials about the event were forwarded and the play therapists also expressed a wish to be involved.

They took on board the idea of dressing-

up and they painted the faces and created cardboard chicken beaks, feet and crests for the children who were there. A colouring-in sheet with a scene from the book was provided and a PowerPoint show projected onto the wall with selected characters from the story enhanced the experience for participants.

The nature of the ward meant that we always knew that there was a risk that the number of children able to attend on the day could be limited. This proved to be the case with only several children participating. Naturally, any sleeping children in the ward at the time were not roused for the event. Nevertheless, the nurses on the ward and the College, hospital and library staff found the event most worthwhile and an invitation was extended to return next year. A copy of *Mrs Wilkinson's chooks* and a children's video were donated by the College to the ward's playroom collection.
