Federal Arts Minister launches Books Alive

Senator the Honourable Rod Kemp, Federal Minister for the Arts and Sport, launched *Books Alive 2003* at Federation Square, Melbourne on Sunday 16 March.

Books Alive is the biggest co-operative promotion of books and reading ever undertaken in Australia. The promotion will run from 2 to 15 August 2003, and will enable readers to buy a book by six high-profile Australian writers for just \$5.00 each (with the purchase of any other book).

The cornerstone of the promotion is *An Anzac's story*, a new book by Roy Kyle, introduced and annotated by bestselling Australian writer, Bryce Courtenay, Senator Kemp announced. The six books and writers are:

Year of wonders by Geraldine Brooks (fiction)

An Anzac's Story Roy Kyle and Bryce Courtenay (biography)

Tashi and Tashi and the giant by Anna Fienberg (fiction 7–10 years)

Toad heaven by Morris Gleitzman (fiction 10–13 years)

My place by Sally Morgan (biography)
Ice Station by Matthew Reilly (fiction)

The titles were chosen from those submitted by publishers. A panel comprising Sandra Yates, Brett Osmond (project director, Books Alive), Margaret Burke (Australia Council), Juliet Rogers (Australian Publishers Association), Anne Davis (Dymocks) and Scott Whitmont (Australian Booksellers Association) made the final selection.

Geraldine Brooks, Anna Fienberg, Morris Gleitzman and Matthew Reilly attended the launch in Melbourne.

Books Alive represents a completely new co-operative network within the book sector. The promotion will present an exciting and compelling opportunity for all Australians, young and old, to buy an outstanding and popular Australian book for \$5.00 and rediscover the pleasure of reading.
