Australian Teacher Librarian of the Year

The Australian Teacher Librarian of the Year (sponsored by ASLA and Pledger Consulting) is a national award that will recognise and honour an exceptional Australian teacher-librarian in a school setting whose professional practice has a positive impact on student achievement and information literacy.

Teacher-librarians are a vital resource in schools. They are required to work collaboratively with teaching colleagues and school administration to promote and support information literacy and literature programs.

Exchange for librarians, educators and administrators

Librarians, professors and administrators commonly temporarily exchange positions with colleagues at other libraries or colleges. Cass Foster, Professor of Drama at Central Arizona College in Coolidge, Arizona has started a free service that provides networking to help facilitate temporary exchanges throughout the world. Most exchanges are for a semester, or at least three months. Some will arrange for a week or two. Some participants also exchange homes and vehicles.

'Everyone has different time restraints and a different reason for participating,' Foster points out. He believes there is a great deal for the individual and the institution to gain when taking advantage of a temporary exchange - especially in a world constantly demanding we become more culturally diverse in our skills and ways of thinking.
