

The third 'Library Books for East Timor' Trivia Night

Friday 6 October 2006, Hawthorn Town Hall (Melbourne, Victoria)

ontinuing the great work in supporting East Timor's libraries a third trivia night will be held on Friday 6 October 2006 at the Hawthorn Town Hall. Brian Nankervis, Melbourne-based writer and comedian, will be the guest Master of Ceremonies Extraordinaire along with other guest trivia masters including Lonely Planet's Tony Wheeler, Reading Books and Music CEO Mark Rubbo, and Anne-Marie Schwirtlich - State Librarian and CEO of the State Library of Victoria. Tickets are \$50 per person. All money raised will go directly to East Timor libraries. Attendance upwards of 400 people is expected.

Libraries in East Timor are heavily used, despite their very poor condition. It should come as no surprise after over 400 years of colonisation and 24 years of occupation that most libraries across East Timor are, without exception, housed in war-ravaged or neglected buildings requiring serious building maintenance. They have none of the equipment and facilities we regard as standard for library services. Public library services are essential to develop reading skills, information services, social programs and skills-based training. Most East Timoreans rely on libraries for access to learning materials and study space. Funds are

desperately needed as most libraries in East Timor have no in-


come and therefore no way of acquiring new books and other learning materials.

A group of dedicated people from the Victorian Public Library Network and the State Library of Victoria have organised two successful Library Books for East Timor Trivia Nights at the Hawthorn Town Hall in 2004 and 2005. An incredible \$58 634 was raised at these two events to assist East Timor's fledgling library network. The organisers of the event are participating purely and completely on a voluntary basis. Partners involved to date are Viclink-Victorian Public Library Network, Australian Volunteers International, State Library of Victoria, Friends of the SLV, Maribyrnong City Council and City of Boroondara.

eacher-librarians who have been making an impact on media literacy in their school can enter for a new award. It is sponsored by EnhanceTV and the Australian School Library Association (ASLA). This national award recognises and honours outstanding





Australian teacher-librarians who demonstrate a high level of achievement in the award criteria, making a positive impact on media literacy within the school.

The award carries cash prizes from EnhanceTV, for use in the library. The first prize is \$1000, and two Highly Commended prizes are also awarded, \$500 each.

The Teacher Librarian Innovation Award for Media Literacy Enhancement is open to qualified teacher-librarians who belong to one of the ASLA member associations and whose school is licensed by Screenrights. (ASLA points out that all government schools and most other schools are licensed by Screenrights.)
