2006 Hans Christian Andersen Awards

HC Anderson Author Award: Margaret Mahy HC Anderson Illustrator Medal: Wolf Erlbruch

very other year IBBY presents the Hans Christian Andersen Awards to a living author and illustrator whose complete works have made a lasting contribution to children's literature. They are the highest international recognition given to an author and an illustrator of children's books. The Author's Award has been given since 1956 and the Illustrator's Award since 1966. The Award, a gold medal and a diploma, is presented at the biennial IBBY Congress. A history of the Awards was prepared for the 2002 IBBY Jubilee Congress. It includes biographies and a selected bibliography of all the winners from 1956 to 2002, as well as the history of the Award.

Nominations are made by the National Sections of IBBY and the award winners are selected from the nominees by an international jury of children's literature specialists. A special Andersen Awards issue of IBBY's journal *Bookbird* presents all the nominees, and documents the selection process. In the 2006 Awards issue Anna Jackson of Victoria University, Wellington discusses Margaret Mahy's

work. Mahy, a New Zealander, worked for the Christchurch School Library Service and was Children's Librarian at the Canterbury Public Library until 1980, when she resigned to write full-time. I'm sure her books are well-known to all children's librarians; Jackson's article briefly and readably summarises some of the strongest themes in her work: families, the recognition of one's own power (and the dangers of misusing it), and the importance of language and narrative. The high quality of Mahy's characterisation and writing makes this a well-deserved award: I still reread her books with pleasure, and I must be thirty-five years older than the 'target audience'.

Wolf Erlbruch is not an illustrator I am familiar with – being limited to English probably has something to do with it – but any library with a multi-lingual collection that includes German titles should probably look him up. His work is published by Peter Hammer Verlag, and titles include *Nachts* and *Die grosse Frage*. He has also illustrated works by other authors.
