Following the success of the 2005 conference on women's collections, 'Simply the Best 2' will reflect on the growing significance of women in the collections of our archives, galleries, libraries and museums.

The conference keynote speaker is Lena Torngvist, Manuscripts Librarian from the National Library of Sweden. She has prime responsibility for the Astrid Lindgren Collection. Astrid Lindgren is a well-known Swedish writer and author of the Pippi Longstocking series — some of the most famous children's books in the world. The Astrid Lindgren Collection is a comprehensive archive containing original manuscripts, letters and press clippings. The archive has been classified by UNESCO for inclusion in the Memory of the World Register and has thus been deemed important to preserve for the whole of humankind.

The themed conference program has presentations on Women and Health, Women and Education, Women and Politics, Women and Research and Women and Social Justice.
