## Cattle producers go online

Livestock producers can now access even more free-to-air livestock production information, via the click of a button.

The 'Livestock Library' website has expanded to include an Industry Search which allows users to search a range of selected livestock production websites.

Users can access more than 22,000 conference papers and journals written about livestock production since the 1950's, State Departments of Agriculture, Meat and Livestock Australia, Australian Wool Innovation

(AWI) as well as the Beef and Sheep CRC websites; all through the Livestock Library.

Launched in 2002, the Livestock Library is co-funded by the CRC for Beef Genetic Technologies, the Australian Sheep Industry CRC and AWI.

"The big benefit is that it doesn't matter where you access the Livestock Library from," said Ruth McIntyre, Manager of the Livestock Library. "You can be in Charters Towers or Meekatharra, you may even be in Uruguay. But in one sitting you can access the full text on a range of subjects."
