

# 15 FABULOUS THINGS TO DO IN ADELAIDE

**G**ot a bit of spare time between events while you're in Adelaide at the ALIA National 2016 Conference? INCITE has it covered for you.

- 1 Spend a few hours at Adelaide Zoo. It's home to 250 species and more than 2,500 animals, including the giant pandas Wang Wang and Fu Ni.
- 2 Visit Hahndorf, the oldest surviving German settlement in Australia.
- 3 Sample the delights of Haigh's Chocolates, which was founded in Adelaide 101 years ago.
- 4 Explore Ebenezer Place, a quaint laneway full of independently owned boutiques and some of Adelaide's best wine cellars and food purveyors.
- 5 Adelaide Central Market, the city's hub for all things food. Not that into food? Pick up some secondhand books.
- 6 The Botanic Gardens of South Australia, in the heart of the city but totally removed from frenetic urban life, is a leafy, flowery oasis of beautifully landscaped gardens and majestic tree-lined avenues.
- 7 Need some more culture? Visit the Art Gallery of South Australia.
- 8 Visit the Flinders Ranges and the stunning Wilpena Pound, a natural amphitheatre of mountains.
- 9 Stop and smell – and taste – the rosé. Visit one of the many wineries in the Adelaide Hills for a spot of wine tasting.
- 10 If, after all of the above, you still have time, why not visit Maggie Beer's Farm Shop in Nuriootpa?
- 11 And, of course, don't forget to drop in to the State Library of SA!
- 12 Looking for a few moments of tranquillity? Visit the Adelaide Himeji Gardens in the south parklands, which was a gift from Adelaide's Japanese sister city, Himeji, in 1982.
- 13 Hop on the tram to Glenelg.
- 14 Have a ball wandering around Rundle Mall.
- 15 Visit the historic house of Carrick Hill at the foot of the Adelaide Hills. Tour the grand home and gardens.
