

# CRIMINAL LAW CONSOLIDATION ORDINANCE 1969

No. 39 of 1969

An Ordinance to amend *The Criminal Law Consolidation Act and Ordinance 1876 to 1968*

[Assented to 29 October, 1969]

**B**E it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Northern Territory of Australia as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Criminal Law Consolidation Ordinance 1969*. Short title and citation

(2.) The *Criminal Law Consolidation Act and Ordinance 1876 to 1968* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Statute.

(3.) The Principal Statute as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as *The Criminal Law Consolidation Act and Ordinance 1876 to 1969*.

2. After the words “Injuries to Cattle, etc.” occurring immediately before section 117 of the Principal Statute the following section is inserted:—

“116A. In each of the next three succeeding sections “cattle” means horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, mule, ass, bull, cow, ox, heifer, ram, ewe, sheep, lamb, camel, llama, alpaca, buffalo, goat or pig.” Definition of “cattle”

3. Section 140 of the Principal Statute is amended by inserting after the word “alpaca” the word “buffalo”. Stealing horses, cattle, &c.

4. Section 388 of the Principal Statute is repealed. Repeal of section 388
