No. 33 of 1968

An Ordinance to amend the Control of Waters Ordinance 1938-1965, and for other purposes

[Assented to 18 June, 1968]

BE it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Northern Territory of Australia, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910-1968, as follows:—

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Control of Short title and citation Waters Ordinance 1968.
- (2.) The Control of Waters Ordinance 1938-1965 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Control of Waters Ordinance 1938-1968.
- 2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by Definitions omitting the definition of "The Director of Water Resources" and inserting in its stead the following definition:—
 - "the Director of Water Resources' means the person for the time being holding, or acting in or performing the duties of the office, created under the Public Service Act 1922-1967, of Director of Water Resources, Water Resources Branch, in the Northern Territory, in the Department of the Interior:".
- 3. Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by Offences and omitting the words "Fifty pounds" and inserting in their stead the penalties words "One hundred dollars".
- 4. The purported exercise of a power or performance of a Validation of function under the Principal Ordinance, at any time during the certain actions period from and including the date of abolition of the Department of Territories to but not including the date of commencement of this Ordinance, by the person who then performed the duties that, immediately before the abolition of that Depart-

ment, were the duties of the office of Director of Water Resources, Water Resources Branch, in the Northern Territory, in that Department, purporting to act as the Director of Water Resources within the meaning of the Principal Ordinance, shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as it world have been if that person had then been the Director of Water Resources within the meaning of that Ordinance.
