## ENDEMIC DISEASES ORDINANCE 1928-1957.\*

## An Ordinance to provide for the Control of Endemic Diseases.

Short title. Short title amended: N. 17, 1938, s. 4. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Endemic Diseases Ordinance 1928-1957.\*

Commencement. 2. This Ordinance shall commence on a date to be fixed by the Government Resident by notice in the Gazette.<sup>†</sup>

Definitions. Amended by No. 12, 1957, s. 2. 3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—

- "Carrier" means any person who harbours in his body a parasite or any developmental stage of a parasite which causes disease;
- "Endemic disease" means Malaria Fever, Dengue Fever, Filariasis, Hookworm disease, Enteric Fever, Dysentery and Relapsing Fever;
- "Health Officer " means any officer appointed under the *Health Ordinance* 1915-1924;
- "The Chief Health Officer" means the person appointed under the *Quarantine Act* 1908-1950 to be the Chief Quarantine Officer (General), Northern Territory.

Persons arriving in North Australia to answer questions of Health Officer. 4. Every person who arrives in North Australia shall answer truly to the best of his knowledge all questions asked him by the Chief Health Officer or any other Health Officer as to his previous residence, his health before and during his journey to

North Australia, and as to the likelihood of his having been exposed to infection of any Endemic disease before or during such journey.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.

5. The Chief Health Officer or any Health Officer may at Examination all reasonable times examine any person for the purpose of Endemic ascertaining whether he is suffering from or is a carrier of any disease. Endemic disease.

6. If any person is suffering or is suspected of suffering Persons from or being a carrier of an Endemic disease, he shall submit Endemic himself to such examination and treatment and comply with disease to submit to such restrictions as the Chief Health Officer or other Health treatment and Officer directs and may be removed or required to proceed to an restriction. isolated place and, if so removed or required to proceed, he shall remain in that isolated place for such period as is directed.

Penalty: One hundred pounds.

7. No person suffering or having suffered from or suspective of suffering from or being a carrier of an Endemic disease movements or suffering from being as is directed, proceed to or enter any the Chief Health disease. part of North Australia which he is directed by the Chief Health Officer or other Health Officer not to proceed to or enter.

Penalty: One hundred pounds.

8. All expenses incurred in connexion with the removal or Expenses of isolation of any person under the provisions of this Ordinance removal, isolation and and the cost of any food and medicines supplied to him may be recovered by the Government Resident from the person so removed or isolated, or, where the person so removed or isolated is a child, from the parent or guardian of the child.

9 --- (1.) The Government Resident may make regulations, Regulations. not inconsistent with this Ordinance, prescribing all matters which by this Ordinance are required or permitted to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to this Ordinance, and for prescribing penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for any breach of the regulations.

(2.) All regulations made by the Government Resident under this Ordinance shall be notified in the Gazette, and copies thereof shall forthwith be forwarded to the Minister.

(3.) The Minister may, by notice in the Gazette, disallow any regulation, and such regulation shall thereupon cease to have effect.
